Research things like: the importance of having a literary agent, and the advantages and disadvantages of selecting a small publishing house over the larger firms. These are important things to understand as a writer seeks to be published. Smaller publishers are usually open to new authors. Small companies provide personalized attention and tend to have faster publication schedules. Those who persevere can succeed in this highly competitive market.
